

Blair's big U-turn over Livingstone

TONY Blair was last night forced to swallow his words as he praised Ken Livingstone and backed him for re-election as Mayor of London. The pair were pictured at a rare joint public appearance — where the PM claimed he was "proud" of Red Ken and joked: "I always said Ken would make a good mayor." But four years ago Mr Blair lobbied against Ken's campaign to head the capital's assembly. Back then he warned: "I believe passionately he would be a disaster — a financial disaster, a disaster in terms of crime and police and business." Yesterday in Kilburn, North London, Mr Blair admitted: "I changed my mind. The reason is I was able to judge on a record that he had, and I have talked to Londoners."
